Against Malaria Foundation

A global UK-based charity with its Canadian branch raising funds to buy mosquito nets for US\$2. These nets are distributed through partners in Papua New Guinea, Togo and Zambia. Mosquito nets help prevent malaria and other mosquito borne diseases, saving lives.



Canadian Feed the Children

Canadian Feed the Children works to help people with food security and education programs. It works primarily in Bolivia, Ethiopia, Ghana, Uganda, and in Indigenous communities in Canada, serving over 200,000 people in F2019.



Canadian Foodgrains Bank

Canadian Foodgrains Bank tackles food insecurity by providing food for people around the world who are hungry due to emergency crisis situations like war, droughts, or floods. It also provides training and assistance for farmers to increase yields.



Doctors Without Borders

Doctors Without Borders delivers life-saving medical assistance in countries around the world that are torn apart by war, disease, and natural disasters. It provides vaccines, medical interventions, surgeries and medical treatments.



Lifewater Canada

Lifewater, based in Thunder Bay ON, provides affordable water and sanitation in Haiti, Liberia, Kenya, and Nigeria. Lifewater reports helping over 58,000 people receive water and sanitation by building 114 wells and other water projects and training in 2018.



Mennonite Central Committee Canada

MCC Canada works with local churches in 57 countries around the world on development projects (education, health, food & water), disaster response, and justice and peacebuilding.



One Drop Foundation

One Drop provides access to safe drinking water and hygiene facilities to people in Africa, India, and Latin America with poor access to clean water and sanitation.



Operation Eyesight Universal

Operation Eyesight Universal provides eyecare for people in developing countries to prevent blindness and restore vision. Operation Eyesight provided glasses, cataract and other surgeries, as well as drug programs to help eliminate avoidable blindness to people in India, Nepal, Kenya, Ghana, and Zambia.



Opportunity International Canada

Opportunity International supports local microfinance organizations in 21 developing countries to provide financial products aimed to empower people, create jobs and build communities. Opportunity International reports that 85% of loans are made to women.



War Child Canada

War Child Canada helps children and women affected by war through education, economic opportunities, and legal support. In 2018, War Child worked with 592,000 people in Afghanistan, Iraq, Jordan, South Sudan, Sudan, The Democratic Republic of Congo, and Uganda.
